COINS FROM QURNAT HARAMIYA (ROSH HA-'AYIN)

Nine coins were found in the excavation at Qurnat Ḥaramiya (see Torgë and Avner 2018).¹ With one exception—a post-reform Ummayad coin found on the surface (No. 9)—all the coins date from the Persian and Hellenistic periods, with a predominancy of coins of Phoenician origin (Sidon, Byblos, Tyre). Although small in numbers, this assemblage shows a continuous chronological sequence from the beginning of the fourth century BCE to the mid-third century BCE, ending with three Ptolemaic coins (Nos. 6–8); no Seleucid coins were discovered. This numismatic evidence corroborates the general dating proposed by the excavators for the latest period of occupation at the site.

The assemblage includes one Athenian *tetradrachma* (No. 1). The appearance of this coin along with Sidonian minute silver coins is not exclusive to our site. Both currencies circulated in our region side by side, and can be found in hoards, as demonstrated by Ariel (2006), who mentions several such hoards in his discussion of the finds from Tel Mikhal.² Interestingly, the Athenian *tetradrachmas* from both Tel Mikhal and our site seem to be contemporaneous with the Sidonian silver coins, dated to the reign of Straton I (371–357/354 BCE; Nos. 2–4).
