1	Bowl	115	1017/1	Incurved rim bowl, well-levigated clay, red slip inside and black outside
2	Bowl	119	1024/1	As above
3	Mortarium	119	1024/2	Orange clay, many white grits. Thickened, outfolded rim, three wide grooves on the inside of the rim.
4	Cooking bowl	114	1016	Pink-brown clay, few small white grits. Wide and shallow vessel, string-cut rim to accept a lid, two horizontal handles
5	Cooking pot	103	1003/1	Orange-brown clay. Spherical vessel, string-cut rim to accept a lid, short, vertical neck with a groove at the joint with the shoulder, ribbing on shoulder
6	Cooking pot	115	1017/2	Orange-brown clay. Spherical vessel, simple rim, short, vertical neck, two large loop handles from rim to shoulder, ribbing on shoulder
7	Cooking pot	127	1024/3	Orange clay, few white grits. Spherical vessel, simple rim, two loop handles from rim to shoulder
8	Jar	103	1003/2	Pink-brown clay, few small white grits. Rounded, slightly outfolded rim, tall neck

No.	Vessel	Locus	Basket	Description
1	Coffee cup	101	1005	Imported from Japan or China, hand-painted gilded vegetal decoration
2	Bowl	127	1030/1	Pink-brown clay, few small white grits. Incurved and outfolded rim, slightly rounded side
3	Bowl	127	1030/2	Black Gaza Ware, few white grits. Rounded, straight rim, slight ridge on side, shallow ring-base with knob
4	Bowl	127	1030/3	As above
5	Cooking pot handle	127	1030/4	'Elephant ear' handle of a hand-made cooking pot. Pink-orange clay, many white grits and mica
6	Milk jug	127	1030/5	Pink-gray clay. Ovoid body, shallow ring-base
7	Jug	102	1002	Yellowish-pink clay, outturned, rounded rim, tall neck
8	Jug (<i>brik</i>)	112	1010	Black Gaza Ware, few white grits. Triangular rim, slight ribbing on neck
